Young South Africans to Dialogue with President of World Church

Silver Spring, MD, USA...Hope Channel will feature Let's Talk South Africa live on December 3, 2006, Sunday, with Pastor Jan Paulsen. Pastor Paulsen, president of the Seventh-day Adventist

World Church, will visit with young people from seven different regions in Africa, including Angola and Malawi.

"Although participants differ in age and embrace a diversity of cultures, backgrounds, education and interests, many of their concerns transcend these boundaries, says Andre Brink, producer for Let's Talk South Africa. "Pastor Paulsen believes that youth are the future of the church and the program will enable the President to keep in touch with issues faced by the youth."

According to Brink, over 80 percent of church members in the Southern Africa-Indian Ocean region are young. Organizers expect some of the topics discussed will focus on HIV/AIDS, relationships, church politics, as well as the role of women in the Adventist Church.

Let's Talk South Africa is produced by the General Conference Communication Department and directed by the Adventist Media Center in the Southern African-Indian Ocean region of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Women to Dialogue with Head of World Church on Hope Channel

Silver Spring, MD, USA...Hope Channel will feature Time to Talk live on Thursday, December 14, 2006, with Pastor Jan Paulsen. Pastor Paulsen, president of the Seventh-day Adventist World Church, will visit with women from England, South Africa, and the U.S. This one hour unscripted dialogue will be broadcast from the Hope Channel studios at the world headquarters of the Adventist Church in Silver Spring, with satellite links to studios in London and Cape Town.

"I am hoping that this dialogue will have a trickle-down impact from Pastor Paulsen to those he speaks and works with—in all levels of the world church," says Heather-Dawn Small, director of the Department of Women's Ministries for the world church and one of the coordinating offices of

this Time to Talk event.

"This is intended as a discussion—not just one-way communication," says Pastor Paulsen. "I want to know what's on women's minds, understand their concerns, and hear their ideas. The women of our church embrace such a diversity of cultures, backgrounds, education, and interests. And yet there are certain significant issues that transcend lines of nationality and language, and these are what I hope we will focus on during our time together."

Abuse, poverty, health, and leadership are among the issues that are expected to feature in this one-hour dialogue.

Pastor Jan Paulsen has been president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists since 1999. Originally from Norway, he has lived in Denmark, Germany, Ghana, Nigeria, and the United States. Since becoming president of this 15-million member church, Pastor Paulsen has looked for ways to improve communication with not only church administration, but young people and women.

Revelations from the Lost Pages of History

Silver Spring, MD, USA...The Seventh Day, a five-part documentary series tracing the history of the Sabbath, will premiere on Hope Channel beginning Friday, April 6, 2007.

Subtitled Revelations from the Lost Pages of History, the series highlights 2,000 years of conflict over the Christian day of worship. From the revolutionary Sabbath teachings of Jesus to the Sabbath-keeping Taiping Revolution in the 19th century China, from the first Sunday-keeping churches in Rome and Alexandria to the Sabbath-keeping reformers of 15th century Russia, The Seventh Day tells the story of the Sabbath as it has never been told before.

Produced by northern California-based LLT Productions, The Seventh Day is hosted by Hal Holbrook and features interviews with over 50 scholars from Catholics, Jewish, Orthodox and Protestant communions.

"While Seventh-day Adventist viewers appreciate the historical presentation that confirms their beliefs about the true Sabbath, we have always had the general television audience in mind," says Jim Wood, writer and associate producer. "The Seventh Day is designed to raise questions in the minds of people who have always taken for granted that Sunday is the biblical Sabbath."

The Seventh Day is based on a concept proposed by James Arrabito, an Adventist artist and lay evangelist who traveled the world for three years tracing evidence of Sabbath keeping. Tragically, in 1990 James and two of his sons were killed in a weather-related plane crash in Alaska. His wife, Pat Arrabito, continued the effort as executive producer. Jeff Wood brought The Seventh Day project to completion as producer/director.

Dear friends,

I'm writing tonight from Nairobi, Kenya. Joe Sloan and I have just concluded three long, intensive days of meetings with division, union, conference and church leadership. This September, in partnership with the East-Central Africa Division, Hope Channel has an extremely ambitious project in Nairobi.

The project is three-fold:

1. Tape the first ever African NET programme with the ECD president, Pr Geoffrey Mbwana preaching in his mother language of Kiswahili and with live audience at the Nairobi Central Church. (17 programmes broadcast by one-week delay on Hope Channel International) Translation in English and French languages.
2. Set up and outfit the worship room at the division headquarters for production. This will be the temporary location for media centre in this region. (See attached photo of ECD grounds and Admin buildings).
3. Train local staff and film in new studio site (and on stage at Central Church) live-to-tape 100 ½ hour shows featuring Family Life, Health Ministries and the best music of this region of the world.

By God's grace we believe He will give us success. God has blessed all the appointments, discussions and plans in Zambia, Philippines and now, Kenya. We are thrilled with the overwhelming enthusiasm and support.

We would like to invite you to take a few minutes and go to our website and see this very latest development for Hope Channel. Click on Project Hope '07—the Ultimate Media Mission Trip! **If you like to travel and have thought about a mission trip, maybe this is an opportunity for you.**

Participate in an exciting form of evangelism using your talents and gifts in media production. Share your skills and knowledge with young, eager and talented media personnel.

We are looking for volunteers to join us in these hectic three week production intensive projects in Zambia, Philippines and Kenya . Producer/ Director, Andrew Hunt from the Adventist Media Centre in Sydney, Australia will be on site directing and coaching the local media teams in Zambia and the Philippines.

Joe Sloan and the HC production team from the GC will be on site in Kenya to direct production and train the new media team here. Each location has launched into serious pre-production work following a carefully outlined Preparation Timeline. Your work on location to tape and edit additional packages and graphics will significantly enhance and add production value.

We sincerely believe that God is asking His church to step out and bring Adventist TV to the hearts of viewers in a culturally adapted way.

I've been inspired recently by Isaiah 43: 1, 10 – 12 and a rather obscure quote in Reflecting Christ:

"These last-day witnesses are bold soldiers of Jesus Christ. They have tasted of the powers of the world to come. Their feet are not on sliding sand, but on solid rock. They are not easily moved away from the faith once delivered to the saints. These will be strengthened with their leader to cope with difficulties. They are messengers of righteousness, representatives of Christ, revealing the triumphs of grace. From these chosen men of God the truth will shine forth. It will be heard from their lips, reflected in their countenances, and demonstrated in their lives."
